

Annual Stormwater Service Report

Reports to: Licking Township

Summary of 2023 services:

During the year of 2023 The Licking county SWCD urban team worked a total of 88.75 hours for Licking township. The running total of outfalls in Licking township was 172 outfalls. Of those 172 outfalls, 114 were newly located and 78 were screened in 2023. Two conservation technical assistance regarding pond management were provided to Licking township citizens and two complaint investigations were resolved as well. There were two active construction sites within Licking township that required a total of 8 inspections during the year of 2023 and there were a total of three plan sets that went through the technical review process.

Goal for Service:

Meet the requirements of the MS4 Stormwater permit by Increasing outreach and educational events within the township. Create a complete Stormwater Map for the township that shows all stormwater conveyances within its urbanized areas and to continue to provide conservation technical assistance to Licking township and its citizens.

Quarterly Consortium Meetings/Trainings:

Of the four annual consortium meetings that occurred in 2023, a representative of Licking township has attended all four. It is required that at least 3 of the four are attended annually by the township. Three of the four consortium meetings held in 2023, provided training to its attendees.

2024 Action Items:

- GIS mapping of all Stormwater conveyances
- Screening outfalls in the township
- Locating and mapping additional outfalls in the township
- Develop and help implement a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan
- Assist with creating and establishing more public outreach and educational events within the township
